



INTERNATIONAL STUDENT GUIDEBOOK

After Admission

According to the regulation on the organization of didactic activities, the deadline for completing all registration and registration formalities, mentioned above, is 5 working days from the beginning of the academic year, respectively the period September 30 - October 4, 2024. The steps mentioned above can be completed in any order provided the deadline is met. Failure to comply with the deadline leads to non-enrollment at the Technical University of Civil Engineering Bucharest.










After Admission

When you go to sign the study contract, don't forget to bring two 3x4cm ID-style photos. These are required for issuing your academic identification documents: the student ID card and the transport pass.
















Academic Identification Documents

These two documents are issued by the university for each student, certifying their enrollment in one of our faculties. They serve as identification and for other official purposes.



In the event of lost documents (student ID and transport pass), duplicates can be issued upon the student's request, following a public announcement of the loss and presentation of the published notice. In cases of withdrawal, transfer, or expulsion, students are required to return their student ID and transport pass, which will be canceled and kept in their file. During any study interruption period, students must submit their student ID and transport pass to the faculty office.

ISIC CARD

Our university has a partnership with ISIC Romania (International Student Identity Card), providing our students with multiple benefits and supporting the digitalization of certain university processes. The creation of the card is included in the enrollment fee, but maintaining it active for external benefits costs 25 RON per year.





When filling out the registration form, don't forget to select the option to issue the ISIC card.







After university verification and approval, your personalized ISIC card will be created for our university.

Institutional Account

All first-year students (bachelor's and master's) have been provided with institutional Microsoft 365 accounts, which include access to Microsoft Office applications, Teams, Outlook, and OneDrive. Please check the email address used during the admission process to access these accounts. For any issues, contact: **o365@utcb.ro**. Communication with the university is conducted exclusively through Microsoft Teams or the institutional email.



Check the email address used during admission; you'll receive an email from Microsoft with a username and temporary password, which you'll need to change afterward. Use these credentials to log in at office.com. If it doesn't work, try using incognito mode.

If you haven't received the email, contact o365@utcb.ro.





Next, set up a recovery email address and phone number to prevent future access issues.



Once logged in at office.com with your new password and email, you'll see a button labeled "Install and More." Select it to install the Office 365 applications, which include Teams, Word, Excel, and others.










Each course has a number of **credits** (between 2 and 6). The total sum of credits for all courses in an academic year is 60. A student who passes a course earns all the credits for that course. To advance to the next academic year, the minimum required credits are:

30 credits (first year) out of 60 possible 90 credits (second year) out of 120 possible

135 credits (third year) out of 180 possible

E - Exams (during the exam session) – written or oral assessment

C - Colloquia (throughout the semester) – written or oral assessment, assignment check, continuous assessment

P - Projects (throughout the semester) – project evaluation, ongoing activity, oral assessment

The assessment concludes with a grade between 1 and 10.

Passing exams, colloquia, and projects requires a minimum grade of 5.







Course Syllabus

A course syllabus is prepared for each subject, which includes at least: learning outcomes, the content for teaching and learning, associated practices for learning, teaching, and assessment, as well as the number of study credits allocated for each activity.

The course instructor organizes the teaching activities within the subject and carries out the teaching duties as outlined in the curriculum and the course syllabus. Verification of the expected learning outcomes for a subject is conducted according to the provisions in the course syllabus, under the strict supervision of the course instructor, who is responsible for the accuracy of the assessment.










Maps Lacul Tei



Maps Calea Plevnei










Housing and Accommodations



UTCB students have the possibility to live in one of the 6 residence buildings (dormitories) placed in Tei campus. The international students, usually quartered in Residence no. 5, benefit from the same accommodation conditions as the Romanian











UTCB residential facilities

Dormitory C3 has 187 rooms and a capacity of approximately 750 accommodation places, Dormitory C4 has 187 rooms and a capacity of approximately 550 accommodation places, and the bathrooms are shared for each module, which consists of 2 rooms. Dormitory C5 has 54 rooms and a capacity of approximately 160 accommodation places, and the bathrooms are private, located in each room. Dormitory C7 has 187 rooms and a capacity of approximately 500 accommodation places, and the rooms are studio-type, with a balcony, private bathroom, and kitchen.



Financial information

The price of a place in the dormitories varies with the accommodation conditions. Furthermore, the University offers a discount from the actual rate, discount which is given upon payment of the following month during the last part of the current month.

UTCB residential facilities

The accommodation of students in UTCB dormitories is based on a renting contract. The renting of a place in a room is done for a single academic year, including all holidays except the summer holiday (for this period another contract can be signed, the price for a place in the room being different). The student shall pay the rent for one month plus a deposit (equivalent of a month's rental fee) which will be refunded at the end of the academic year. If, by any reason, the student moves out from the dormitory during the academic year, this deposit will not be returned.









Medical and Health Services

UTCB health services

In UTCB Tei campus, the Student's medical assistance office is located on the ground floor of Residence No. 4. It provides basic consultations and treatment, and, if necessary, directs the student to a specialized clinic or hospital (schedule: 7:30-19:30).

Medical emergency

The total fee includes the practical internship and the exams session; the fee does not include housing, meals or other expenses.

The yearly fee covers a number of 60 credits.

Tuition fees

For undergraduate and master studies, for the 2024 - 2025 academic year, the study fee for international students was set as it follows:



For doctoral studies, for the academic year 2024-2025, the study fee for all international students was 2610 Euros/year for the full-time (intra-mural) programme and to 870 Euros/year for the part-time (extra-mural) programme. The fee for the public defence of the thesis is 540 Euros.

- Examination fee for participation in overdue credit sessions 45 euros
- Repetition of the exam at the completion of bachelor's and master's studies 225 euros
- Annual tuition fee preparatory year Specialized languages: Engineering sciences, mathematics, economics 2430 euros
- Annual tuition fee preparatory year Specialized languages: Biological, biomedical and socio-human sciences 2880 euros

Tuition fees

For undergraduate and master studies, for the 2024 - 2025 academic year, the study fee for international students was set as it follows:



In order to sign up for the 2024-2025 academic year at UTCB, a 120 lei fee was requested (~25 Euros).

Credit's value

For the situations in which a student has to pay credits in order to retake an exam, for the academic year 2024-2025 the value of one credit was set at 75 lei (~16 Euros).

Fee for equivalence of previous undergraduate studies

The fee to validate subjects from previous undergraduate studies (regardless of the number of credits that may be recognised and transferred), for the academic year 2024-2025 was set as it.







EU students

Students nationals of European Union, European Economic Area member state or Swiss Confederation who wish to stay for more than 3 months on the territory of Romania must access the web page of the General Inspectorate for Immigration at: https://portagli.mai.gov.ro and transmit the following documents:

- standard application;
- identity card or passport (original and copy);
- documents certifying that the person is enrolled in UTCB;
- proof of the means of subsistence;
- proof of health insurance;
- fees.

The registration certificate is issued on the same day.







Non-EU students

In order to obtain the long term residence visa for studies, from the Romanian diplomatic missions and consular offices, non-EU students must first be accepted for enrolment at UTCB.

To obtain the long term residence visa, students must submit the following documents:



I.For undergraduate, Master or PhD students:

- proof of acceptance for studies, issued by the Ministry of National Education and Scientific Research, attesting that they will attend full time education;
- proof of payment of the tuition fee for at least one year of study;
- proof of the means of subsistence, amounting to at least the minimum national net wage per month, for the entire duration mentioned in the visa;
- certificate of Criminal Record or other document having the same legal value;
- medical insurance during the validity period of the visa.







Non-EU students



I.For participants in a student exchange programme:

- proof of acceptance for studies, issued by the Ministry of National Education and Scientific Research, attesting that they will attend full time education;
- proof of participating in a student exchange programme, performed by an organization incorporated according to the law and recognized for this purpose;
- proof from the organization performing the student exchange, attesting that it insures them means of subsistence and the costs for their return;
- medical insurance during the validity period of the visa;
- proof of accommodation at a family selected by the organization performing the student exchange and which owns the dwelling space considered normal for a Romanian family.

The visa fee is 120 Euros and is paid in the country where the application is submitted. The long-stay visa (type D) allows a stay in Romania for up to 90 days and can be extended by submitting a request to the Romanian Office for Immigration. The extension request must be submitted in person at least 30 days before the visa expires. Overstaying the visa results in its cancellation and requires the individual to leave Romania.







Non-EU students



In order to extend their residence right for studies, undergraduate, Master or PhD students must submit the following documents:

- application;
- document for crossing the border (Passport, travel document, etc.) in original and in copy;
- letter of acceptance for studies to be requested only upon the first extension of the residence right;
- certificate issued by the higher education institution;
- proof of the means of subsistence amounting to at least the minimum national net wage per month, for the entire validity period of the residence permit;
- proof of the legal ownership over the dwelling space (in original and in copy);
- medical certificate;
- fees.







Non-EU students

Foreign citizens who turned 26 years old need a social health insurance for the extension of their temporary residence right, in accordance with Law no. 95/2006 concerning the health system reform.

International students who did not graduate during the initially granted period may benefit from the extension of their residence right over a maximum period of one year. The residence permit will be renewed with at least 30 days before the expiry of the previous one.

The temporary residence right for studies will be extended successively by 1 year periods. The residence permits for citizens receiving scholarships from the Romanian State will be granted over a period equal to the total duration of studies.

The residence right can be extended by at most 90 days after graduation, for the final settlement of the school or academic record and for the endorsement of the study documents.


Non-EU students, who study in Romania and hold a residence permit in this purpose, canbe employed only parttime (4hours/day).For this, a workpassmust be obtained.






Microcredentials (Bachelor), ONLINE












ROMANIAN INVENTIONS TIMELINE
















Why Bucharest

In the Middle Ages the Greeks called it "HILARIOPOLIS – The City of JOY"; in the 1800s it was considered "Le Petit Paris", fully living up to the name – for everything the city represented back then, today there is no exaggeration to say that BUCHAREST – The Capital City of Romania – is indeed a modern city in European style.





LOCAL TOURIST'S ATTRACTIONS



The Romanian Athenaeum is a concert hall in the center of Bucharest and a landmark of the Romanian capital city. Opened in 1888, the ornate, domed, circular building is the city's main concert hall and home of the "George Enescu" Philharmonic and of the George Enescu annual international music festival.

The Triumph Arch is a triumphal arch located in the northern part of Bucharest, on the Kiseleff Boulevard. The first, wooden, triumphal arch was built in haste after Romania gained its independence (1878), so that the victorious troops could march under it. Another temporary arch was built on the same site, in 1922, after World War I, which was demolished in 1935 to make way for the current triumphal arch, which was inaugurated in September 1936.





Stavropoleos Monastery, during the last century when the monastery was dissolved, is an Eastern Orthodox monastery for nuns.

Its church is built in Brâncovenesc style. The name Stavropoleos is a Romanian rendition of a Greek word, Stauropolis, meaning "The city of the Cross".





The National Village Museum - a great open air spectacular museum, of traditional original wooden houses brought from all over the country (some of them being more than 150 years old).

Once a rundown area, the Old City Centre became a vibrant quarter for entertainment and tourists, boasting antique shops, theatres, boutique hotels, restaurants, and bars, some of which stay open around the clock in the summer.



Day 1: Bucharest – Targu Jiu (2 nights)

Departure from Bucharest to Targu Jiu, the home of the great sculptor Constantin Brancusi, nicknamed 'the poet of the carved forms'.

Day 2: Targu Jiu - Hobita - Tismana Monastery

The day begins with a pedestrian tour of the center of Targu Jiu. The main tourist destination is the Sculptural Ensemble Constantin Brancusi. In the Central Park on the shores of Jiu, we will admire two of the most representative monuments of the famous artist, the Gate of the Kiss and the Table of Silence.

Day 3: Targu Jiu – Curtea de Arges – Targoviste – Bucharest

Departure from Targu Jiu to Curtea de Arges, a place full of history, legends, a quiet and beautiful place where we will discover together the Monastery of Curtea de Arges, the place where the Romanian kings sleep for eternity.









MEDIEVAL TRANSYLVANIA

Day 1- Bucharest-Prahova Valley-Bran-Brasov

On the way, we will admire the Prahova Valley, one of the most famous tourist regions in the Carpathian Mountains with the Busteni, Sinaia and Azuga resorts, situated in the majestic shelter of the Bucegi Mountains. Not for nothing, the beauty and the wildness of these places led King Carol I of Romania to raise his summer residence, Peles Castle, in Sinaia. Then we arrive at Bran, an ancient pastoral settlement, which still preserves its traditions. Bran Castle is the only Castle in Transylvania which corresponds to Bram Stoker's description, the whole world refers to it as Dracula's Castle.

Day 2-Brasov-Sighisoara

Travel to Brasov, where we have free time, then dinner and hotel accommodation.

Day 3.Brasov-Sibiu-Bucharest

Breakfast at the hotel, then we will travel to Sibiu which, in 2007, was the European Cultural Capital.









THE MAGIC LAND OF DOBROGEA

Day 1: Bucharest - St. Andrew's Cave - Adamclisi - Murighiol

The first stop is in one of the most revered Christian places in our country, the cradle of the Romanian Orthodoxy: St. Andrew's Cave. Considered the 'Bethlehem of Romanian Christianity'. We will continue with a stop at Adamclisi in order to visit 2 sights that marked the past of the Romanian people - the birth certificate of Latin Romania - the Tropaeum Traiani Monument and Fortress, built in 106-109 by the great architect Apolodor of Damascus, as a tribute to the defeat of the Dacians (year 102) by the Romans ruled by Trajan, the Roman Emperor.

Day 2: Danube Delta trip

Breakfast at the hotel. Traveling to the Danube Delta's most beautiful arm – Sfântu Gheorghe. Free time available for beach and bath in the sea. Then, we will start sailing on canals and lakes: Erenciuc, Puiu, Rosu, Rosulet - called the heart of the Danube Delta, and we reach the Sulina Branch.

Day 3 – Murighiol-Enisala-Constanta-Bucharest

After serving breakfast, we will visit the ruins of the Halmyris fortress in Murighiol, one of the most important archaeological sites in Romania.
